



Since our founding days, our services have grown far beyond just Guide Dogs to include a wide range of community initiatives, and training and education programs.

Today we work to ensure people with low vision or blindness are active and involved members of the community. We do this by teaching practical skills to help children and adults reach their personal potential: regardless of when or how they became affected by low vision or blindness. These skills are developed under our Orientation and Mobility training programs and with the support of Occupational Therapists.

The number of Victorians who need our services is growing every year, and low vision and blindness will significantly increase over the next decade due to conditions of ageing and diabetes.


At Guide Dogs Victoria, it is essential that we plan for the future and ensure our sustainability, so that we can continue to support Victorians for many years to come. The magic of

At Guide Dogs Victoria, we provide services to Victorians of all ages.




Mobility and independence

We offer a comprehensive range of Orientation and Mobility services that are available to people of all ages, including children.


'Orientation' refers to our understanding of where we are in the environment. 'Mobility' relates to our ability to move safely and confidently through the environment.

Our Occupational Therapists teach skills to independently perform all kinds of daily tasks, and to support each Client's journey to achieve their personal goals.

Our dogs

Our Guide Dogs undertake comprehensive, world-class training by our respected Guide Dog Training Team.

This includes comprehensive safety and relationship training, and detailed behavioral analysis from an early age. We think it's important to learn each dog's skills and temperament to gain an intimate understanding of how they might eventually match with our Clients.

Every Guide Dog goes through an intensive training program to learn the skills required to navigate communities – from busy city streets, to the uneven paths and tracks of rural environments. After training, dogs are matched with their Handler through a detailed selection process that caters for each Client's personality, mobility needs, and lifestyle.

The average working relationship of a Guide Dog and a person with low vision is between eight and ten years. As a result, it is absolutely essential that a Handler and a Guide Dog share a powerful bond, built on trust, companionship and a strong connection.

Leaving a gift to Guide Dogs Victoria is a simple process

By leaving a gift in your Will, you can make a profound change to the life of a person who is blind or has low vision.

You may never meet the person whose life your kindness changes, but they will never forget you.

All gifts are greatly valued and significantly help in our future planning.

Having a valid Will is the only way you can ensure that your wishes will be met as a Will needs to be regularly updated and reviewed to reflect your current circumstances.

When creating your Will, firstly provide for your loved ones, and then consider leaving a lasting legacy to Guide Dogs Victoria.

A gift can take many forms:

Residuary

The remainder of your estate after specific gifts have been disbursed.

Percentage

A percentage of either residue or the entire estate.

Pecuniary

A specific gift of cash.

A Specific Asset

Real estate, shares or other particular items of value.

Leave a gift in your Will

Consult your legal advisor to ensure the option you have chosen best reflects your intentions.

Discuss your decision with your family and loved ones. This will ensure they understand and support your reasons for choosing to help Guide Dogs Victoria in such a special way.

By becoming a member of the Otus Fellowship, you will be invited to special events that will help you see how your future gift will benefit Victorians who are blind or have low vision.



It is an honorary and exclusive membership that brings together like-minded supporters of Guide Dogs Victoria.

The Otus Fellowship was named to honour one of our champion stud dogs, Otus, a legend at Guide Dogs Victoria. His first litter produced six Guide Dogs and one Pets as Therapy Dog. Otus officially retired from the program in 2004 at 10 and a half years of age. He was honoured in November 2004 when he received a medallion from the Board of Directors. He is still fondly remembered by a large number of Guide Dogs Victoria supporters.


Thank you from Guide Dogs Victoria

Thank you for taking the time to consider leaving a gift in your Will to Guide Dogs Victoria, and helping us to continue to breed, raise and train our beautiful dogs.


