
Help Guide Dogs change lives for many years to come

- \$234,000 general veterinary and nursing care which includes consultations for health checks, vaccinations and routine surgeries.
- \$15,000 medications.
- \$24,000 emergency care and treatments.
- \$38,000 other veterinary associated costs.

Frequently asked questions

How many dogs and puppies does Guide Dogs Victoria care for each year?

Our veterinary program cares for approximately 180 dogs and puppies each year.

Does the government help with Guide Dog expenses?

Guide Dogs Victoria receives less than 25 percent of its funding from the government. Not all of our Guide Dogs or their associated costs are funded by the government, which is why your support is so important.

Can I give more than \$10,000?

Of course! Any amount you'd like to give above the standard support level as a Vet Partner will be gratefully received and will directly support Guide Dogs' veterinary program.

Can I fund a specific piece of equipment?

As a group, Vet Partners fund the planned equipment needs of the veterinary program. Opportunities to fund unexpected purchases will arise from time to time. Our Philanthropy Team can provide additional information when advised by our canine facilities staff.
