Isla is my eyes, my freedom and my independence. She is always by my side and we trust each other with everything.

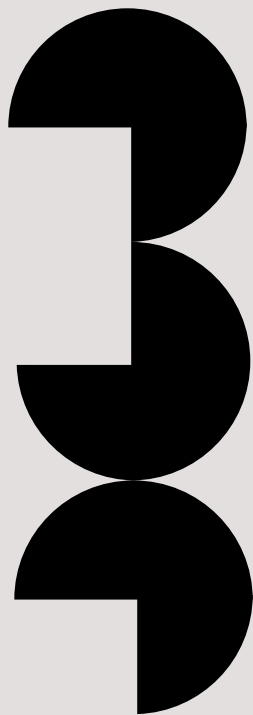

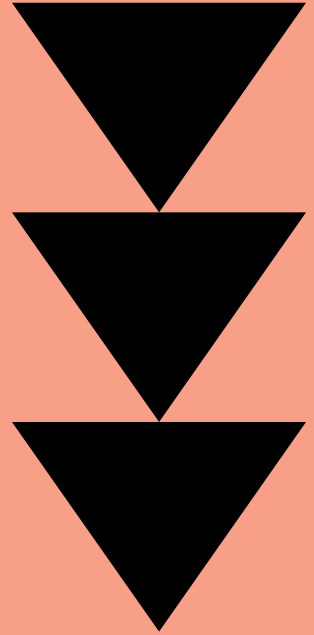

Your gift will support the breeding and raising of our puppies.

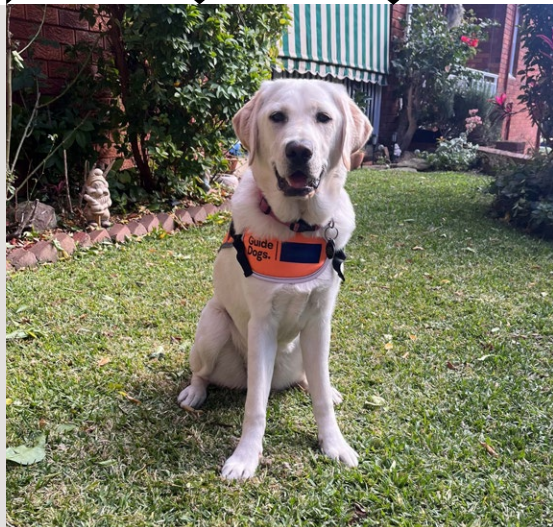

Once you have discussed your intentions with your loved ones and made the generous decision to include Guide Dogs NSW/ACT in your Will, it's important to consult your legal advisor to ensure the option you have chosen best reflects your intentions. We recommend you seek the advice of an independent solicitor or qualified legal advisor before making any changes to your Will.

It is important that Guide Dogs NSW/ACT is correctly named in your Will.

The following wording is suggested for your consideration and discussion with your solicitor.

free of all duties and testamentary expenses for its general purposes and I direct that the receipt of that organisation shall be sufficient discharge to my executors for this bequest.



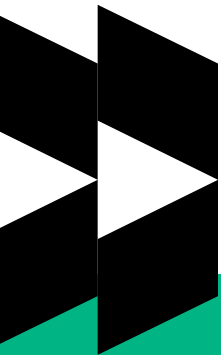
The Daisy Circle.

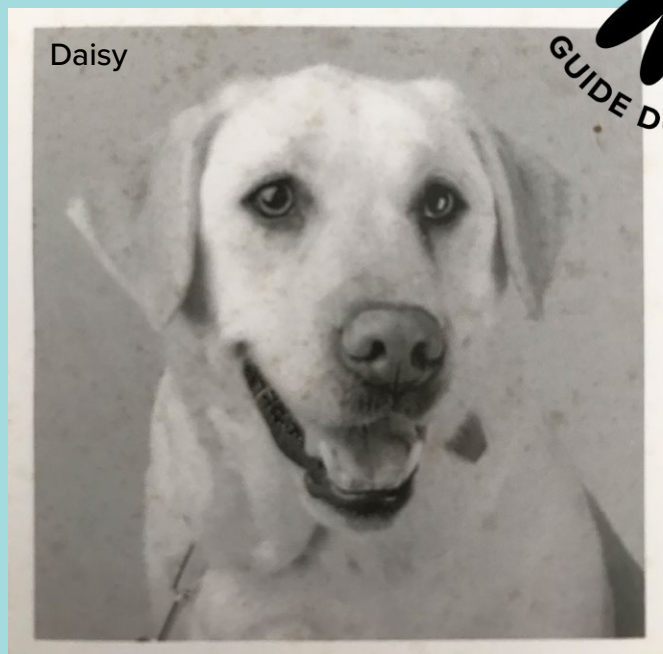
