The bond between a Handler and their Guide Dog is like no other. Many Handlers describe their Guide Dog as an extension of themselves, and that connection doesn't just vanish when their Guide Dog retires.

Many Guide Dog Handlers may find it difficult to pay for their dog's needs when they retire, as they are no longer supported by NDIS funding. With retirement comes an increased cost of food, vaccinations, potential surgeries, medicine, and general care.

Covers veterinary expenses, including emergencies and routine procedures as dogs age.
